NASHVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY RECOGNIZED FOR SUSTAINABILITY EFFORTS



Library Receives Official Certification and Grant

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Nashville Public Library will enhance its food waste education, thanks to a \$5,000 grant through <u>Urban Green Lab's Nashville Food Waste Initiative</u>.

Urban Green Lab has also awarded the library's Sustainability Committee with a Silver certification for its growing commitment to sustainable practices and sustainability education.

"I'm immensely proud of NPL's Sustainability Committee. Their hard work to make NPL a more sustainable institution deserves recognition, and it helps us create a clean, healthy environment for generations to come," Interim Library Director Terri Luke said.

NPL's Sustainability Committee formed in July 2021 to educate and engage library staff and patrons on environmental sustainability and climate change issues.

In the committee's first year, they coordinated a tree pick-up event for the Tennessee Environmental Council's Tennessee Tree Day, as well as two litter cleanup sessions by NPL staff at the library's Bordeaux and Green Hills locations.

Urban Green Lab's certification program is designed to recognize organizations that are committed to creating a culture of sustainable practice through workplace education.

Certifications are awarded in Gold, Silver and Bronze tiers. To become certified, an organization completes an assessment that scores seven different categories of sustainability practices.

A score of 61–80% is required for a Silver certification.

Each tier yields different benefits provided by Urban Green Lab, including dedicated social media posts, discounts for the lab's Roundtable membership and more.

"Nashville Public Library is a symbol of learning in our city, and now, an example of sustainability exploration. Their leadership is an inspiration for other Nashville workplaces striving to be the same," Urban Green Lab Executive Director Todd Lawrence said.
